

Governor Perry Reappoints Fred W. Heldenfels IV to the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board

AUSTIN, Texas, August 27, 2007 – Governor Rick Perry has reappointed Fred W. Heldenfels IV of Austin to the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board for a term to expire August 31, 2013. Mr. Heldenfels is President and CEO of Heldenfels Enterprises, Inc., a family-owned business founded in 1909 that manufactures precast/prestressed concrete structures for Highway, Commercial, Marine/Industrial and Sports construction markets.



Mr. Heldenfels received his B.B.A. from Texas A&M University (TAMU) in 1979. He is a member of the San Marcos Economic Development Board, current chairman of the Citizens Against Lawsuit Abuse of Central Texas, and past chairman of the Texas A&M Twelfth Man Foundation Board.
